Primavera is an organization of Bosch employees mainly to support underprivileged children in developing and emerging countries to offer them a new perspective with better opportunities in life through its various projects worldwide.

Primavera was founded in 1990 by ten Bosch associates. Today Primavera has more than **900 members**, the majority of whom consists of current and former employees of the Bosch Group mostly. Thus, the social responsibility of the company founder Robert Bosch is being carried on in the world with conviction.

The projects from Primavera basically go beyond short-term life support, Primavera does not limit its initiatives on medical care or the basic needs, but to provide a variety of care, education and training services for the sustainable development of children and adolescents.

Primavera is committed to offer children a way out of the poverty cycle. Therefore, we support many educational and vocational training activities to enable them get an independent self-determined life beyond poverty in the long-term. Primavera is mainly active in the regions of Asia, South America and South Africa - where children are affected by poverty and hardship, and this year (2015), Primavera celebrates its 25th anniversary.

Supported are 38 projects in 15 different countries, reaching more than 30,000 children with specific & individual care, which are managed and supervised by volunteering employees at the local Bosch locations and together with social facilities on site. Thus, every euro donated by members, friends, sponsors flows directly into the projects.

primavera india

Primavera started its activities in India **20 years ago** by the employees of the company Robert Bosch.

In India, Primavera supports various projects, including school & vocational education, health, and livelihood of less fortunate children at orphanages, refugee camps, residential schools, day care centers, and crèches in slums including special children etc.

10 Projects are supported across **5 Cities** benefiting around **1000 children**.

Funds are being received from Primavera Germany, however, contributions from India have also started.

In India, every second child drops out of school before reaching middle school. 45 million children of school going age in India work instead of attending school.

Vision

Increase access to secondary and higher education for rural girls with a focus on reducing gender and social disparities.

Objectives

- The centre will help the girls to gain wider knowledge and skills to face challenges and feel motivated to continue in schools, build confidence and self esteem to raise voices to resist pressures against marriage at an early age.
- To enhance parental and community support to keep girls in schools and promote higher education, through delayed marriages.
- To instigate scientific thought in them including logical and reasoning skills.
- To improve girls' knowledge about sexual and reproductive health, training self defence mechanism and improve their access to services.

BACKING EDUCATION FOR 02 EQUALITY

Shanti Bhavan educates the most socially and economically disadvantaged children of rural India. Children at Shanti Bhavan come from meager backgrounds, primarily of the 'untouchable' – Dalit – caste. Without the intervention of an education, these children are destined to a future of abuse, social segregation and discrimination.

Shanti Bhavan selects children at the **age of four** to be the first in generations of their caste to receive an education. Once educated, the children will be able to help their families and communities break out of the vicious cycle of poverty and become successful and productive members of society.

Shanti Bhavan continues to support them financially and oversees their progress through a careful mentoring program.

For the mothers of young children in Thangamalai slum, who mostly work as domestic help in households in the north of Bangalore, the Crescent Trust day care center is a blessing. For almost twenty years the trust has helped provide day care facilities for their children, ranging from the ages of two and a half to five.

Now run by Mr. Benedict Joseph, the Trust was started almost two decades ago by his wife who saw that the women in the slum struggled to hold down their daily wage jobs and also take care of their children. If they missed work for a day, the family might very well have to miss their meals, too.

Crescent now runs three separate facilities in North Bangalore. Since its founding, it has taken care of around 2000 children and doesn't charge parents for this service. The reason it can afford to do so is the complete funding provided by Primavera. A mid-day meal scheme is also provided at the care center for the children.

It was one of the first projects **supported by Primavera India.**

Sri Ramachandra Grameena Vidya Vikasa Kendra, Bangalore (SRGVVK) is a school for children from families living below the poverty line.

The parents work mainly as laborers in agriculture, construction and as domestic help. It was started in 1991 and provides education for children from classes one to seven.

Primavera has started a computer lab in the school and also conducts medical camps for the students. Daily distribution of Nutritional Drink to all school children were launched with the support of Primavera that benefits 150 children.

06 SUPPORTING **EDUCATION** OF TRIBAL CHILDREN

The main object of this school is to provide education for poor and unprivileged children from tribal backgrounds. Established in the year 1999, this is a residential school only for tribal children. Classes are held from 1st to 12th standard.

The school is situated on 6 acres of land in a green campus, and the building comprises 10 class rooms, library, laboratory, girls' and boys' hostels, and kitchen. The results for secondary school certificate examination are consistently very good.

The school premises has 14 classrooms, 3 Science labs, the library and the computer room. A huge dining hall and water filter plant is also available, constructed with the help of Bosch Ltd (Nashik Plant). Primavera India is a major supporter: a sports teacher, music teacher, art teacher and a computer teacher have been sponsored by Primavera and they are doing good job, according to the school management.

HOPE FOR REFUGEE CHILDREN

Indira Gandhi International Academy

Bangalore, India

Indira Gandhi International Academy (IGIA) is a unique residential school fulfilling the needs of the **Sri Lankan Tamil Refugee children** who have been displaced from their homes in Sri Lanka, due to the war and housed in various refugee camps in India and who are unable to have access to education.

The Academy, run under the auspices of "Bright Society", is devoted to uplifting innocent victims of the crisis in Sri Lanka. IGIA tries best to make the students forget their bitter past memories of the war they have seen and to forget the torture and traumatic experience they underwent during the war and during the period of refugee life in the refugee camps and to give them back their lost childhood.

Primavera has extended support to IGIA to cover their students' education expenses including books, uniforms and stationeries, food and festival expenses and has also sponsored teachers for Computer, English and Mathematics subjects.

IGIA conducts a vocational training course with the help of Primavera, which includes a Diploma programme in **Tailoring** and **Handicrafts** for 10 grown up girls, so that they can earn a living once they go back to their respective refugee camps.





Aishwarya Trust

Chennai, India

Aishwarya Trust organises screening, diagnosis and funding for surgeries for underprivileged children who are suffering from Congenital Heart Diseases (CHD). Early diagnosis and timely surgery has saved the lives of many of these children.

In the last seven years, Aishwarya Trust has enabled lifesaving surgeries of more than 900 children and through their screening program, thus touching the lives of more than 35,000 children in the states of Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry and Karnataka.

Financial **support from Primavera** has enabled Aishwarya Trust to further achieve their objectives of helping underprivileged children.



HOLISTIC SUPPORT FOR GIRL CHILDREN 09

Prasanna Trust

Bangalore, India

Prasanna Trust creates a safe environment for vulnerable girls during their most formative years of development. It serves as home for underprivileged and destitute children in need of care. Prasanna Trust works to **provide girl children with a safe and comfortable home** where they can realize their full potential.

The Trust provides the inmates with clothing, food, education, shelter, and above all the love and affection that a child normally gets from its own kith and kin. The children are mostly sent to English medium schools and are taught dance, music, karate and public speaking art. This apart, children are also provided with value-based education, which they will be requiring once they go out of the organization.

Many girls after completing their education at Prasanna are well settled in life. Some of them are in well paid jobs in MNCs and technology companies and many have got married.



NON-INSTITUTIONAL SOLUTIONS FOR UNDERPRIVILEGED CHILDREN 10

Ashraya Foundation

Kolar, India

Ashraya Foundation was set up by a group of women, who were all Child Welfare professionals, with a view to bring in quality care for children in residential care, which at the time, was sorely lacking. The organization works on the firm belief that institutions should only be a temporary shelter for children. Therefore its mission is to provide non-institutional solutions for underprivileged children through education and family support.

Ashraya Neelbagh School is a daycum-residential, co-educational school addressing the long-term educational needs of children of migrant workers and below poverty line families from the neighboring villages.

The Kannada medium school has classes from LKG to 10th standard, follows SSLC syllabus, and has a large component of vocational training as part of the curriculum. Ashraya's programs include Tara Women's Centre and Community Crèches at six different locations in Kolar.

Education, Boarding, Hostel, Health and Vocational Training activities of Neelbagh School receive support from Primavera.
